Economic Needs Assessment Alison Smith (SCOEDD)	SCOEDD recently conducted an economic needs assessment in Klamath and Lake counties in concert with RARE and all seven of Oregon's economic development districts between January and April 2021. 21 people were interviewed and over twenty reports analyzed to develop trends. SCOEDD produced a draft report and are working on developing combined EDD report. Many local themes were identified, such as the need of Broadband, Capacity and Funding, and increasing business and financial and digital literacy. Statewide themes include the need to address barriers and needs such as Small Business Support, Workforce Development, Built Environment and Land Use.
