COVID-19 Messaging	Blue Zones Project is developing a COVID-19 messaging toolkit with OHA grant funds which

Key to Oregon Study (Lynda Daniel)	OHSU is attempting to recruit 100,000 Oregonians for the Key to Oregon study that will help study COVID-19. 5,000 invitations have been sent in Klamath and Lake counties, but only 101 people are current participating. 9,000 Oregonians have signed up statewide. Part of the study may require participants to conduct confirmatory self-swab tests that will be developed by Oregon State Laboratory. Results will be shared with OHA and local public health, with contact tracing to follow as necessary.

Healthy Klamath Connect (Maria Ramirez)	Healthy Klamath Connect is the name of the Aunt Bertha platform in Klamath County with the goal of creating a single location for community referrals. The platform is now live and can be found at <u>http://healthyklamathconnect.com</u> .

Tobacco Litter Prevention (Merritt Driscoll)	Blue Zones Project received grant funding to reduce tobacco litter in Klamath Falls. As part of this grant, BZP will implement four strategies: 1) review tobacco laws/ordinances, 2) place cigarette butt receptacles downtown, 3) distribute portable, pocket ashtrays, 4) raise public awareness about tobacco litter (billboard on Main St.; radio; newspaper). Nine Sidewalk Buttlers will be installed downtown near high litter areas, like Pinky's, Library, etc on August 3 rd .
Parks as Nutrition Hubs (Taylor Hampton)	IYS is working to implement a nutrition hub in Mills that will serve as year-round nutrition hub in the heart of Klamath Falls. On August 25 th , there will be a drive-thru "End of Summer Lunch" event at Mills Kiwanis Park.
	IYS is collecting information about food insecurity screening in Klamath Falls.

Nutrition Oregon Campaign (Kelsey Mueller)	Community-wide nutrition campaign was selected as the priority in Klamath Falls. This will encompass gathering information from providers (OBs, midwives, pregnancy center, birthing center, etc.), training CHWs and lay professionals in the Developmental Origins of Health and Disease (DOHaD), and unify data collection.
Community Updates	 Stillwaters Hospice House – Katherine Silver – a new project in Klamath County aimed at providing a place of comfort, safety, and dignity at the end of life regardless of the ability to pay. Newly received 501(c)3 status and working to develop fundraising. For more information, contact Katherine Silver at stillwatershospicehouse@gmail.com. Living Mindfully – Blue Zones Project and Sky Lakes Wellness Center are hosting a free virtual screening of "My Year of Living Mindfully." Register and watch the documentary from Aug 15 – Sept 15.
