Preventative food pantry, raised 20,500 to support Sanford Children’s clinic; Kicking off local food challenge ○ Nutrition Oregon Campaign- working on focus group, developing key messages to share with providers, Looking for additional committee members if interested please reach out to Kelsey Mueller (kelsey.mueller@healthyklamath.org). ● Suicide Prevention (Patty Card): <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ KBBH continues to provide crisis intervention training teaching how to respond to crisis intervention; Virtual suicide prevention town hall will be held in September, will share videos from video conference; have had suicide losses this past quarter ● Infant Mortality (Katherine Duarte): <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Cribs for Kids Safe Sleep Initiative took off this last quarter, Sky Lakes received certification, only 1 of 2 hospitals in Oregon to do so, Pregnancy Hope Center became licensed partner and Safe Sleep Ambassador; Public Health purchased 30 Safe Sleep survival kits includes pack and play, sleep sack, a fitted crib sheet and information pack ○ Maternal Nutrition Initiative working with food bank to host produce connection, and supporting farmers market double up food bucks program, ○ New TOTs resources are located on www.healthyklamath.org and also working with Cascades East to follow up on prenatal appointments and no shows to increase connection to care ● Physical Well-being/Activity (Merritt Driscoll): <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Moore Park Playground Project has raised 25% of funding need, still seeking funding from organizations and individuals, please reach out to merritt.driscoll@healthyklamath.org if your organization is interested in learning more or sponsoring a piece of equipment. ○ Wayfinding signage will be installed on the Link River Trail at the end of the summer and then plan scale up to Lake Ewauna Trail ○ City Schools K-8 SRTS virtual summer camp series, register before July 31 to be entered into bike raffle; walking and biking safety videos being created with KU media class. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Klamath County Community Corrections secured funding from the Oregon Community Foundations’ Project Turnkey to purchase and renovate the former Oregon Motel 8 on Highway 97 N for transitional and emergent housing as part of Project Homestead.
