TGM Grant Erik Nobel	The City of KF was awarded an 18 month transportation growth management (TGM) grant and they are the first in the state to focus on trails and connectivity with this type of grant. The purpose is to research urban trails and connectivity in the city and create a priorities list so that when funding becomes available they can apply and they'll have shovel-ready projects. Having this master plan of prioritized trail/connectivity projects makes you more competitive for grant funding. They plan to create a citizen and a technical advisory committee.	
Protected Bike Lane Update Katherine	The pop up bike lane at 3 <sup>rd</sup> Thursday was a big success! Columbia donated the plywood and IYS constructed the planters with the help of OHSU nursing students. Now they are working to identify the most appropriate route for the protected bike lane as well as seeking funding. The proposed route is from Moore Park, down Oregon Ave, to downtown.
